




Рассказ основан на реальных событиях.

This story is based on true events that happened in Russian Siberia in May 2021. Minister of Health of Omsk Region Alexander Murakhovskiy disappeared in taiga and wandered for 3 days. Survivor groups were checking the woods and thought he had died already when he showed up in the Basliy village alive and in a good health. He said he was lost and could not find the way back. He did not say everything that has happened to him. Only informed about 2 nights, one night in an old abandoned wagon and the 2nd night under the tree when he was scared of the bear. I have carefully put all events together from different resources like the one below (you can watch a piece of news from YouTube Channel 360 degrees) and added some details that have been missed in his interview but that should have been as he wandered in the wild for 3 days.

PRACTICE

The following are the recommendations how to work with the book to achieve better results.

(1st and 2nd certification level). Rather high level of the Russian language, which allows you to communicate at working, educational and professional fields. Very good grammar.
